BEAUTIFICATION OF POPE JOHN PAUL II

Please join Bishop DiMarzio as we celebrate a Diocesan Mass of Thanksgiving in honor of the Beatification of Pope John Paul II at the Cathedral Basilica of Saint James on Sunday, May 22, 2011, at 4:30 PM. Saint James is located at 250 Cathedral Place, Brooklyn NY, 11201. NEW ROMAN MISSAL

The new Roman Missal becomes effective the 1st Sunday of Advent, November 27. While the scripture readings remain the same, there will be some significant change for the prayers both the people and especially the priest say. This fall we will distribute to you some helpful guidelines about these changes and Fr. Cush will speak at all our Masses the weekend of October 29-30 to explain the new translation to us. All the priests in the diocese are attending a 4 hour instructional class on the new Roman Missal on Thursday, May 12. While we might all find it awkward at first, please God we'll all adjust to it in time.
