PPC MEETING OF APRIL 5, 2011

The first item on the agenda was a review of the response to the letter and feedback form we received from the Planning Commission and Parish Taskforce on December 21, 2010 on our self study document on the Parish. Some new information was added to the response, which will be sent to the Bishop in May. The reports for the High School, Ministries, and Elementary School then followed.

Sister Valeria noted that many of the activities that she had described in her report at the last meeting as "to occur", had in fact occurred as planned and scheduled. In particular, she mentioned that the presentation of the play, "Arsenic and Old Lace" and the SAT retreat for Juniors (academic and spiritual preparations for taking the SAT) were successful.

The status of hosting some "Theology on Tap" events, which are geared to young adults, at St. Saviour was discussed. The coordinator of the program agreed to stage some of these events at St. Saviour Parish Hall as long as we would provide the refreshments. We are in the process of determining possible dates. The Confirmation of 45 Confirmandi from the Elementary School and School of Religion was held successfully on Sunday April 3.

The next item of discussion concerned expanding the Nursery Program for three year-olds in the Elementary School. Our new nursery program has been very well received and successful. We had many parents express interest for September. Because of this increased interest we hope for a second class in September.

Fr. Murphy then began the Parish report stating that we had received a letter on March 24 from Bishop DiMarzio acknowledging receipt of our Stewardship Report and thanking us for keeping him informed. He also mentioned that Sean Dineen would install brass hand rails in the Church Sanctuary and Sacristy to provide assistance for those climbing the altar or sacristy stairs.

Fr. Murphy next stated that on April 11, Bishop Caggiano, Sr. Angela Gannon, and Tom Chadzutko would be meeting with the pastors of IHM, Holy Name, St. Francis Xavier, and St. Saviour (the other school in our cluster, St. Augustine doesn't have a school) to discuss the future of Catholic Education in the diocese and in particular in our cluster.

There was a general discussion about the reports and different media we use and it was proposed that we should make sure we post parish events that are listed in the Bulletin on our Facebook site. The next item under discussion involved extending activities at the Jazz Mass. We currently have Wine/Cheese at the hospitality Sundays, but the possibility of setting up a "Supper Club" and has been explored with different local restaurants.

The discussion then turned to the Liturgy changes, and Fr. Murphy said that the Tablet has been publishing a series of articles on them. In addition, the priests will have an orientation session in early May, but the actual changes would not go into effect until November 27, 2011.

SUMMER SCHEDULE

Our summer schedule of Masses commences on June 19 when our Sunday morning Masses begin at 9:30 AM and 11:30 AM. Our Saturday Vigil Mass remains at 5 PM and our Sunday evening Mass remains at 5 PM, but it will not be a Jazz Mass. During the summer there will not be music at our 5 PM Sunday Mass. As of Monday, June 20, we will have only 1 weekday Mass, at 9 AM. This summer schedule will be effect through Labor Day. Our regular weekday schedule resumes on Tuesday, September 6 and our regular Sunday schedule resumes on Sunday, September 11.
