PARISH HOUSE SUMMER SCHEDULE

During the summer, the parish house will be closed each Monday, but open Tuesday–Thursday, from 9 AM–3 PM and Friday, from 9 AM–1 PM. There are no evening or weekend hours. If you would like to speak to a priest, please call to schedule an appointment.

SUMMER MASS SCHEDULE

Our regular Sunday schedule of Masses resumes on Sunday, September 11 at 8:30 AM, 10:00 AM (Family Mass) and 11:30 AM. Our Saturday and Sunday evening Masses remain at 5:00 PM. As of Tuesday, September 6, we'll resume our regular weekday schedule of Masses at 6:45 AM and 9:00 AM. On Saturday morning, there is only one mass at 9:00 AM.

CATHOLIC FUNERAL MASS CELEBRATIONS

In recent years, especially since 9/11, eulogies have been common at Catholic Funeral Masses. While it is wonderful and often very touching to hear family and friends share memories of their deceased loved one, the more proper setting for eulogies is during the Vigil (wake) service. The Vigil (wake) service celebrates our loved one's life on Earth while the Funeral Mass celebrates our loved one's union with God in heaven. The chapel in the funeral parlor can be (and often is) adorned with pictures and mementoes (and sometimes even a video) capturing special occasions in our deceased loved one's life; this is the time to eulogize him/her. You may wish to do so at the graveside service and/or at the family luncheon as well, but it is best not to have eulogies during Funeral Masses. Thank you for your understanding.

NEW ROMAN MISSAL

A new translation (called The Roman Missal) of many of the prayers at Mass becomes effective on the first Sunday of Advent, November 27. In the fall, we will distribute to you a helpful guide to these new prayers. Fr. Cush will preach at all of our Masses the weekend of October 28-29 to explain the changes.

MASS INTENTIONS

A few years ago, Bishop DiMarzio directed that up to five intentions could be accepted for weekend Masses. This would afford the family and friends of the deceased (or sometimes living) more opportunity to attend the Mass since many cannot come on weekdays. Here at St. Saviour we limit to three the intentions we accept for the weekend Masses. In order to accommodate as many requests as possible we cannot guarantee a single Mass intention at weekend Masses. However, we always have only a single Mass intention at our weekday Masses.

PARISH GIVING OPTIONS

Option 1: Traditional weekly offertory ENVELOPES. Please contact the Parish House to enroll.

Option 2: ELECTRONIC GIVING THROUGH PARISH PAY. This offers you the opportunity to have predetermined monthly amount withdrawn from your checking account or credit card. Please visit parishpay.com to join or contact the Parish House.

Option 3: If you do ON-LINE BANKING for your other household expenses, you can simply do the same for the parish offertory. Just go to your repeating payment screen and set up St. Saviour Parish as a payee account. You will be given the option to set up the payment on a weekly or monthly basis.
